**Approval under section 42DF for use of restricted representations by Scholls Wellness Company Pty Ltd**

I, Rowena Love, as a delegate of the Secretary to the Department of Health and Aged Care, on receipt of an application from Scholls Wellness Company Pty Ltd, have approved under section 42DF of the *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*, the restricted representations described in Paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, for use in advertisements for the products identified in paragraph 1.a, 2.a, 3.a, 4.a and 5.a, respectively (including on the label and packaging of the goods)

**Approved representations**

1. 'Diabetes' when used solely in the context of the cautionary statements:
  - "Scholl and diabetes"; and
  - "People with diabetes should consult a healthcare professional before use"
    - a. "Travel Socks" (ARTG 462107)
2. 'Diabetes' when used solely in the context of the cautionary statements"
  - "If you have diabetes, poor blood circulation or loss of feeling in the feet, consult a healthcare professional before use".
    - a. "Bunion Cushions - Shield, bunion" (ARTG 462106)
3. 'Diabetes' when used solely in the context of Open Blisters, cuts, and Grazes and the statements:
  - "People with diabetes should consult a healthcare professional before use"
    - a. Wound hydrogel dressing, sterile (ARTG 462673)
4. 'Diabetes' when used solely in the context of the statements:
  - "Scholl and diabetes"; and
  - "Do not use Scholl's Freeze Away Max if you have diabetes, poor blood circulation, or a condition that weakens your immune system. Do not use if you are pregnant or breastfeeding".
    - a. Scholl Freeze Away MAX Verruca & Wart Remover - Cryogenic spray, cutaneous (ARTG 447270)
5. 'Diabetes' when used solely in the context of the cautionary statement:

– Do not use if you are diabetic.

- a. Scholl Freeze Away Skin Tag Remover - Cryogenic spray, cutaneous (ARTG 431870)
