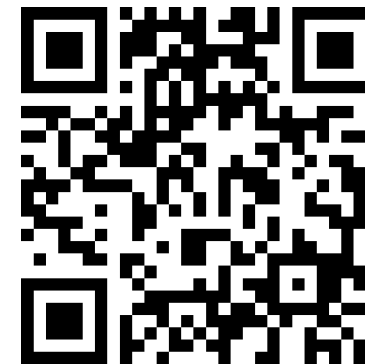

Overview of Statutory Advisory Committees

The TGA's statutory advisory committees are established under Part 6 of the Therapeutic Goods Regulations 1990 (the Regulations).

There are seven statutory advisory committees that provide independent expert advice on specific scientific and technical matters:

- Advisory Committee on Biologicals (12 members)
- Advisory Committee on Medicines (20 members)
- Advisory Committee on Vaccines (10 members)
- Advisory Committee on Complementary Medicines (8 members)
- Advisory Committee on Medical Devices (16 members)
- Advisory Committee on Chemicals Scheduling (8 members and 9 members nominated by the States/Territories)
- Advisory Committee on Medicines Scheduling (8 members and 9 members nominated by the States/Territories)

Conduct of meetings

Statutory advisory committee meetings can be held either:

- in person at the TGA offices in Fairbairn, ACT
- virtually via MS Teams
- Hybrid ie. mix of in-person and MS Teams depending on travel restrictions and member preferences.

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Conflicts of Interest and Confidentiality Obligations

- Applicants are required to sign a **'Declaration in support of application'**
- Members are required to sign a **'Deed of undertaking in relation to confidential information and conflict of interest'** upon appointment to a committee. The Deed sets out the obligations related to disclosure of interests.
- A member is not necessarily excluded from participating in a committee meeting because they have a conflict of interest. Rather, the conflict must be disclosed and managed appropriately.
