Dear Deputy Premier,

State support for the rescheduling of codeine products

We are writing to request your support for a nationally consistent approach to medicines scheduling regulations following the Therapeutic Goods Administration's (TGA) decision to reschedule codeine to a Schedule 4 drug, preventing over the counter (OTC) sales of products containing codeine by pharmacies from 1 February 2018.

Under the Western Australia Medicines & Poisons Regulations, your jurisdiction can decide to vary TGA scheduling decisions and provide exemptions. Whilst the RACGP respects this remit, the rescheduling of codeine is a necessary step to improve patient safety and reduce harm, with current evidence showing that up to 150 Australians are now dying from codeine-related overdoses each year. The only effective way to reduce the dependence and harm these OTC products cause to our patients, their families and communities is to ensure the scheduling decision of the TGA is implemented without exception across all jurisdictions.

In addition, the work of the Nationally Coordinated Codeine Implementation Working Group (NCCIWG) must be fully supported by all stakeholders, including State health departments, to ensure the effective and consistent implementation of the rescheduling of codeine to a Schedule 4 drug, and assist in the provision of support and information for consumers.
