The Government are not removing all complementary medicines from therapeutic goods legislation, in September 2016 the Government agreed to recommendations made by the Expert Review of Medicines and Medical Devices Regulation (MMDR Review). As part of this program of work, the TGA conducted an initial public consultation on a range of high level options on the possible future regulation of a variety of low risk therapeutic goods, including homoeopathic products. The options explored for all identified product types ranged from maintaining the status quo to removal from the TGA's regulatory framework altogether. Any new regulatory arrangements that may be specifically proposed for homoeopathic products in the coming months will require careful consideration and further public consultation. All concerned stakeholders will be given further opportunity to comment.

In addition to this the Government also agreed to enhance the regulatory framework for complementary medicines and are currently implementing nineteen (19) recommendations for reform. The first five recommendations have been consulted on and are now in the implementation phase for commencement in January 2018. The next five will be consulted on in the second half of 2017 with implementation scheduled to commence in early 2018. Consultation and implementation on the remainder will take place throughout 2018.

Implementation of the reforms will:

- support consumer health decisions by increasing the information available about the safe and effective use of complementary medicines; and
- improve transparency for both industry and consumers and help improve rates of regulatory compliance by establishing a catalogue of approved ingredients and a list of permitted indications for use in complementary medicines.
- increase certainty of processes and increase flexibility for industry by making greater use of assessments for ingredients by comparable overseas regulators; and implementing new product approval pathways.

We have received an urgent request for "campaign words" from Minister Hunt's office.

As per the emails below, it appears multiple Ministers have been seeking advice from Minister Hunt in relation to the "Your Health, Your Choice" campaign (see website: <https://www.yourhealthyourchoice.com.au/>). There is also an attached piece of correspondence which represents the type of enquiries the Ministers are receiving.

Among other things, the campaign appears to raise the following points:

- *Biased and flawed reviews that mislead the public*
- *Private health insurance rebates for complementary medicine abolished*
- *Deny the existence of good quality, scientific evidence showing the health and cost benefits of complementary medicine healthcare options*
- *Have homoeopathic and other products banned from sale in pharmacies*
- *Introduce drastic TGA regulatory policy change to remove complementary medicines from therapeutic goods legislation, compromising public safety*
- *Stop universities teaching complementary therapy courses*

I am aware that the TGA will not be able to address all the points raised in the campaign, however, if you agree perhaps we could address only those issues that are relevant to the TGA?

In the meantime I will inform MPEG that other areas of the department/government should also be consulted – **your advice on which areas specifically is greatly appreciated.**

Regulation of Homoeopathic Products

The role of the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) is to ensure that therapeutic goods available for supply in Australia are safe and fit for their intended purpose to protect the public health of consumers.

In Australia herbal products, vitamins, minerals and nutritional supplements, some aromatherapy products and certain homoeopathic products are regulated as complementary medicines under the Therapeutic Goods Act 1989 (the Act) by the TGA. Currently in Australia, most homoeopathic medicines are considered to be of very low risk and are not required to be on the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods, providing they comply with certain requirements.

On 24 October 2014 the Australian Government announced that there would be an expert panel review of the regulation of medicines and medical devices (MMDR review). In September 2016, the Government agreed to most of the recommendations made by the Expert Panel. As part of this program of work, an initial public consultation has been conducted on the possible future regulation of a variety of low risk therapeutic goods, including homoeopathic products. The options explored for all identified product types ranged from maintaining the regulation as it already is, to removal from the TGA's regulatory framework altogether. Further public consultation will be conducted before any new regulatory arrangements are proposed by Government. We encourage you to keep abreast of the consultation process via the 'open consultations' link on the TGA website to ensure that your valuable input is included.

It may also interest you to know that as part of the MMDR recommendations the Government also agreed to enhance the regulatory framework for complementary medicines in a number of ways. These reforms will improve transparency for both industry and consumers and support consumer health decisions by increasing the amount of information that is available about the safe and effective use of complementary medicines.

NHMRC Homoeopathy Review

NHMRC uses standardised, internationally-accepted methods and quality assurance processes to ensure that the evidence it utilises in developing advice has been identified, appraised and interpreted in an appropriate and transparent manner. These standards were applied in conducting the Homoeopathy Review as well as the evaluation of a number of natural therapies as a part of the Department of Health's Review of the Australian Government Rebate on Private Health Insurance for Natural Therapies. The approach to the review, the evidence base and the final report are all detailed on NHMRC's website at <https://www.nhmrc.gov.au/health-topics/complementary-medicines>.

The Review of the Australian Government Rebate on Private Health Insurance for Natural Therapies

The Government has not made any decision to restrict private health insurers from offering benefits for complementary medicine.

The Review of the Australian Government Rebate on Private Health Insurance (the Rebate) for Natural Therapies (the Review), was overseen by the Department's Chief Medical Officer, to determine if Natural Therapies should continue to attract the Rebate.

- The report of the Review was published on 16 November 2015. This report is on the Department's website.
- Evidence on 17 natural therapies was assessed by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) which contributed to the Review.

Natural therapies continue to be covered by the Rebate. Where natural therapies are covered by a private health insurance policy, the policy will continue to attract the Rebate. The proportion of the rebate linked to natural therapy benefits within general treatment products is relatively very small. At this point, decisions on the coverage of natural therapies in private health insurance policies continues to be a commercial matter for each insurer.

The Government has established the Private Health Insurance Advisory Committee to provide advice on possible reforms to improve the value of private health insurance for consumers. The Committee is considering a range of issues, including product design for both hospital and general treatment insurance.

None of the natural therapies considered by the Review of the Australian Government Rebate on Private Health Insurance for Natural Therapies are listed on the Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS). Therefore, these therapies do not attract Medicare rebates.
