Fragrance ingredients

Anise alcohol,

An application to create new entries in Schedule 6 and Appendices E and F for anise alcohol was received from NICNAS in November 2016 for consideration at the March 2017 meeting of the Joint Advisory Committee on Medicines and Chemicals Scheduling (see Application considered at the March 2017 Joint ACMS-ACCS meeting). The proposed amendments to be considered at the meeting were published on the TGA website on 22 December 2016.

In March 2017, the committee advised that new Schedule 6 and Appendix E and F entries be created for benzyl salicylate.

On <u>17 May 2017</u> the delegate decided to defer the interim decision for anise alcohol to allow for further consideration of its use in therapeutic goods and the potential to elicit skin sensitisation reactions at very low concentrations. The advice of the scheduling committee was to create a new Schedule 6 entry with very low exemption cut-off concentrations for domestic or personal products that would result in skin contact during use due to potent skin sensitisation. Similar restrictions are likely to apply to listed therapeutic products when applied topically.

On <u>15 September 2017</u> the delegate made an interim decision to create new Schedule 6 and Appendices E and F entries for anise alcohol with an implementation date of 1 February 2019.

Safety Direction: 4 (Avoid contact with skin).

However, on <u>31 October 2017</u> the delegate deferred making a final decision stating:

'The deferral of a final decision will allow the delegate the option available under the legislation to seek further advice, including from the Joint ACCS-ACMS at its July 2018 meeting, and from industry, prior to making a final decision. The final decision will not be before 8 November 2018 (the publication date of final decision outcomes of July 2018 meeting). Should the final decision require an implementation date, it will be announced at the time of publication and will not be before 2020'.

Benzyl salicylate,

An application to create new entries in Schedule 6 and Appendices E and F for benzyl salicylate was received from NICNAS in November 2016 for consideration at the March 2017 meeting of the Joint

Advisory Committee on Medicines and Chemicals Scheduling . The proposed amendments to be considered at the meeting were published on the TGA website on <u>22 December 2016</u>.

In March 2017, the committee advised that new Schedule 6 and Appendix E and F entries be created for benzyl salicylate.

Cinnamaldehyde

An application was received from NICNAS in November 2016 to create new entries in Appendices E and F, and Schedule 6 for cinnamaldehyde with exemption concentration cut-offs for dermal preparations in line with international standards. The application was for consideration at the March 2017 meeting of the Joint Advisory Committee on Medicines and Chemicals Scheduling. The proposed amendments to be considered at the meeting were published on the TGA website on 22 December 2016.

The advice of the scheduling committee was to create a new Schedule 6 entry with very low exemption cut-off concentrations for domestic or personal products that would result in skin contact during use, due to potent skin sensitisation. Similar restrictions are likely to apply to listed therapeutic products when applied topically.

On <u>15 September 2017</u> the delegate made an interim decision to create a new Schedule 6 entry for cinnamaldehyde in alignment with committee advice. However, on <u>31 October 2017</u> the delegate deferred making a final decision stating:

'The deferral of a final decision will allow the delegate the option available under the legislation to seek further advice, including from the Joint ACCS-ACMS at its July 2018 meeting, and from industry, prior to making a final decision. The final decision will not be before 8 November 2018 (the publication date of final decision outcomes of July 2018 meeting). Should the final decision require an implementation date, it will be announced at the time of publication and will not be before 2020.'

Amyl and hexyl cinnamaldehyde; isoeugenol

These fragrance ingredients were referred to the 13th Joint ACCS-ACMS meeting (July 2016). See <u>Proposed amendments to the Poisons Standard</u> published on TGA website 26 May 2016 inviting public consultations (isoeugenol <u>proposed amendment</u> published on TGA website 3 February 2017).
