10.2 Vaccine reports

During the 6-week period from 1 July to 15 August 2006, 88 reports of vaccine adverse reactions were lodged. This represents 8% of the reports lodged for the period.

Of the 88 reports, 45 related to children and 40 to adults, with the age in 3 cases being unstated. [REDACTED]

About 36% of the reports describe injection site reactions and another 14% described rash, urticaria or pruritus. Details of reactions associated with individual vaccines are shown in the Table, below. [REDACTED]

About 50% of the reports were received from States, Territories or Local Government Shire Councils; 36% were received from health professionals; 10 of the reports were received from sponsors (mainly CSL); and 1 was from the Australian Vaccination Network.

The case reports for all vaccines received in the period covered by the Meeting were provided to ADRAC.
