Dear Sir/Madam

I have been advised that the TGA wants to restrict the use of homeopathic medicines and have called for submissions. You have not given a great deal of time to publicise the changes you propose to make to the regulation of Homeopathic medicines and this is very concerning to me as a user.

In my opinion, homeopathic medicines are harmless and do not pose a risk to health unlike some other medications available through pharmacies such as Enbrel, Thalidomide, Zocor, Mevacor, warfarin (rat poison) etc.

Homeopathic remedies cannot cause side effects and you cannot become addicted to them. This is because only a very minute amount of the active ingredient is used in a specially prepared form.

Homeopathic medicines work by stimulating the immune system. Once your immune system is strong and functioning effectively, many of your ailments will naturally disappear.
