FUTURE REGULATION OF 'LOW RISK' PRIDUCTS UNDER THERAPUTIC GOODDS ADMINISTRATION: KEEP HOMEOPATHY REGUALTED THE WAY IT IS NOW.

My concern is that homeopathic treatments being excluded or not available for the Australian consumers under the future regulation of "low Risk" products mentioned on page 46-49 on the consultation paper.
