

To The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA),

It is MY WILL to send this submission to express my concerns about **Homeopathy being at risk of being “banned” in Australia.**

Options 3 and 4 are particularly concerning because they would completely alter how homeopathy in Australia is viewed. If they were adopted, no claims whatsoever will be permitted for products of homeopathy, not even traditional ones allowed at present. As a consumer of homeopathic products, I would not be able to receive any self-help information about homeopathic remedies for different ailments and conditions. For a homeopath to prescribe a remedy to me would be potentially illegal.

For homeopathy to no longer be recognised as a therapeutic good is ridiculous, as is the practice of homeopathy becoming illegal. It is widely used in Europe and they regard it very highly, just ask the Royal family in England!!

The ban of homeopathy in Australia would be totally outrageous, unacceptable and completely unnecessary!
Homeopathy does no harm!

Is it not the TGA's role to protect public safety? The TGA's role is not to make value judgements on faulty evidence, nor is it their role to restrict access to non-harmful products that the

people of Australia freely decide to administer as therapeutic goods.

Homeopathy is the safest option of any medicine available. I support Options 1 and 2. I strongly oppose Options 3 and 4, as I want to protect my rights and access to homeopathy.
