The research shows very little risk to users, I have read the papers linked in your decision as well as doing my own research, noting a recent 2017 report supports there is low level of risk - " This study demonstrates that a small, yet significant from a public health perspective, proportion of poppers users have visual symptoms. Clinical correlation is required to determine whether these reported symptoms are due to poppers associated maculopathy, or an alternative cause." - https://bmjophth.bmj.com/content/1/1/1

Banning or making a substance illegal will not stop its use or supply. My concern is you will overnight make the activity that many gay men (who use amyl) engage in illegal and further making amyl illegal will simply mean users will get their supply through illegal sources.
