I am totally apposed to **Option 4** and also apposed to **Option 3** – Exempt homeopathy from listing. **Option 2** states: Keep it the way it is but require scientific evidence for high level claims. . I am all for collecting more scientific evidence for homeopathy, however, when the word 'required' is put in, as well as the undefined term "high level claims' with all the restriction that may apply then **Option 2** is not a good Option either.
