

To Whom it May Concern at the TGA

I am concerned about proposed restrictions on homeopathy and would like to see homeopathy continue to be regulated the way that it is here in Australia. As every authority around the world considers homeopathy a 'low risk' medicine, I do not support any restriction on something as beneficial and low risk as homeopathy.

I understand the TGA is here to protect our safety in relation to medicines, not to restrict access to safe medicines such as homeopathy.

Me and my family have benefited greatly from having access to homeopathic medicines to treat flu, ear infections, bladder infections, to name a few. This has resulted in less antibiotic use which can only be positive, given that we have now entered into the era of antibiotic resistance. Surely we need to be supporting low risk medicines that help us heal without resorting to high risk pharmaceutical drugs.
