## RANZCO submission to consultation: Proposed changes to the classification of active implantable medical devices and their accessories

The Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Ophthalmologists (RANZCO) welcomes the opportunity to comment on consultation: Proposed changes to the classification of active implantable medical devices and their accessories
