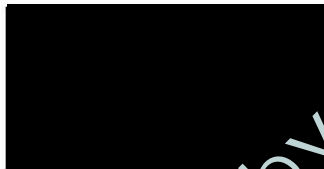

1 Name

This instrument is the *Therapeutic Goods (Restricted Representations—Commonwealth Health Campaigns) Permission 2018*.

2 Commencement

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsections 42DK(1) and 42DK(4) of the *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*.

4 Definitions

Note: A number of expressions used in this instrument are defined in section 3 of the Act, including the following:

- (a) Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code; and
- (b) therapeutic goods.

In this instrument:

Act means *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*.

Commonwealth health campaign means a campaign about a public health matter that is conducted, approved or funded by the Commonwealth.

restricted representation has the same meaning as in section 42DD of the Act.

serious form of a disease means a serious form of a disease within the meaning of subsection 28(1) of the Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code.

5 Permission

For subsections 42DK(1) and 42DK(4) of the Act, in relation to each item, the restricted representations specified in column 2 of the table in Schedule 1 to this instrument are permitted to be used in an advertisement specified in column 3 of the table about the therapeutic goods specified in column 4 of the table, subject to the conditions (if any) specified in column 5 of the table.
